Natalie Naylor was on the faculty of Hofstra University for more than thirty years, where she taught Long Island history and other courses in American social history. She was director of the Long Island Studies Institute at Hofstra, from when it was founded in 1985 until she retired in 2000. **Professor Naylor** had responsibility for Institute conferences and publication and has edited or co-edited several of the Institute publications including *Nassau County: From Rural Hinterland to Suburban Metropolis* (2000); and *Journeys on Old Long Island* (2002).

Dr. Naylor is president of the Nassau County Historical Society and has been editor of its annual *Journal* since 1991. She has written many articles on various aspects of Long Island history and frequently speaks at historical societies and libraries.
